PAINTED CANVAS FLOORCLOTH CLASS- Arundel, Maine

Lisa Curry Mair travels a few times a year to teach classes away from her studio. Each class uses a specific theme (folk art, theorems, tavern signs, for example) and students create a 2' x 3' floorcloth based on this theme. The steps to making a floorcloth are covered as well as lots of instruction in painting- composition, shading, color theory to name a few topics. All of the supplies- primed and hemmed 2'x3' canvas, brushes, templates and paint- are supplied to each student. Classes are usually 2 days long, giving students time to complete or nearly complete their floorcloths.

Classes usually quickly fill to 10 students for plenty of individual attention.

Per student tuition is \$320 plus 1/10th of the travel/shipping fees (\$16 for this class). Students come away from the class with a finished (or nearly finished) floorcloth, a reusable template, brushes and the knowledge and confidence to create more similar floorcloths!
